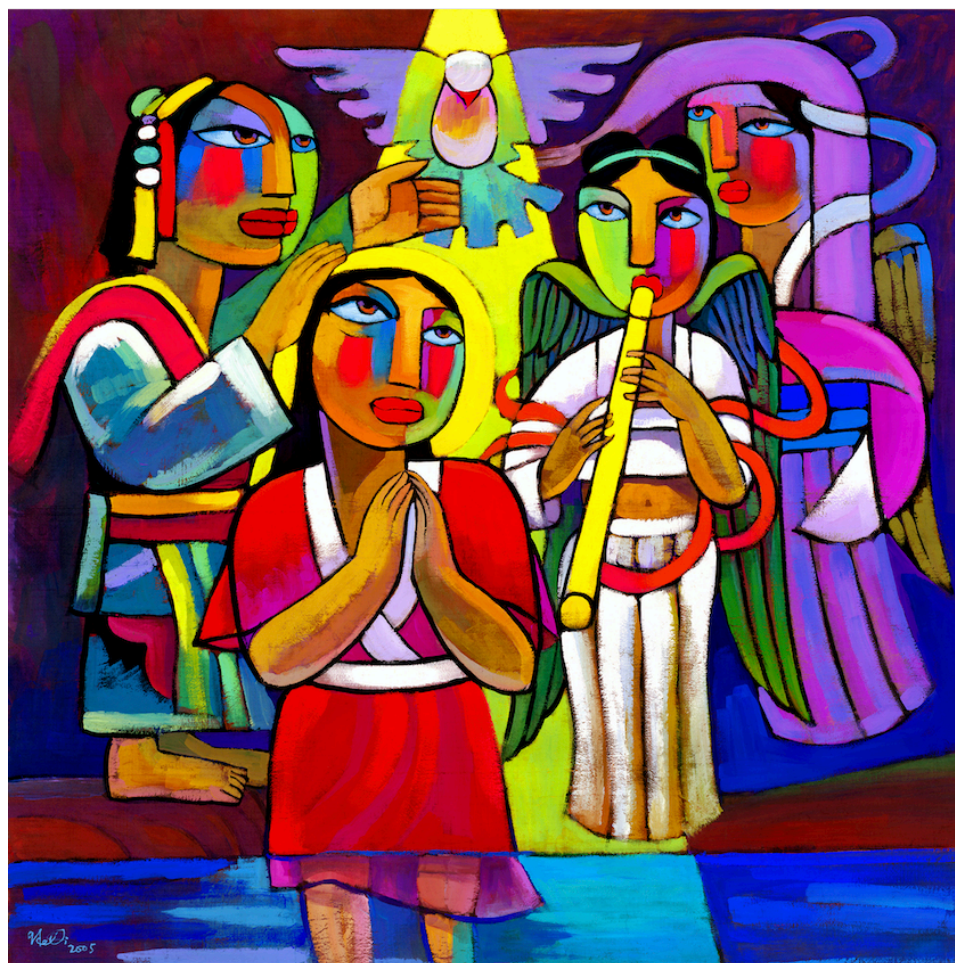

The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented

(the candidate who is unable to answer for himself is presented by his parents and Godparents)

Parents and Godparents

We present Winston Michael Cato-Fox to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

(when all have been presented the Celebrant asks the parents and godparents)

Celebrant Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents **I will, with God’s help.**

Celebrant Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Godparents **I will, with God’s help.**

(then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the parents and godparents on behalf of the infant and younger children)

Question Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer **I renounce them.**

Question Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer **I renounce them.**

Question Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer **I renounce them.**

Question Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Answer **I do.**

Question Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer **I do.**

Question Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Answer **I do.**

(after all have been presented, the Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying)

Celebrant Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

People **We will.**

(the Celebrant then says)

Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Celebrant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity
of every human being?

PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATE

(the Celebrant says to the congregation)

Let us now pray for Winston who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and forever. ***Amen.***

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

(the Celebrant blesses the water, first saying)

Celebrant The Lord be with you.
People **And also with you.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
People **It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

(the Celebrant says)

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was

anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

(at the following words, the Celebrant touches the water)

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE BAPTISM

(the candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who then immerses, or pours water upon, the candidate, saying)

Winston, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

(then the Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross [using Chrism if desired] and saying)

Winston, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

(when this action has been completed for the candidate, the Priest, at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over them, saying)

Celebrant Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

(the Celebrant says)

Let us welcome the newly baptized.
